

HOPKINSVILLE ART GUILD MINUTES

August 9, 2016

Hopkinsville Art Guild met August 9 at 1 P.M., with Betty Liles, VP, presiding. Those present were Jeannie White, Angela Comperry, Beverly Atwood, Jim Wille, Tanya and Jeff Ezell, Charlotte Hendricks, Nancy Stalls, Susan Rochelle, Leoma and David Lowery and Carolyn Self

Minutes from July 12 were approved as presented.
